LEADING OFF

- Georgia State opens the 2017 season with the third annual Atlanta Challenge as Marshall, Western Michigan and BYU visit Atlanta for one game each at GSU, Georgia Tech and Kennesaw State. This year's event features a unique twist as Georgia State will play a rare Monday game against BYU.
- The Panthers have won four straight Opening Day games, including last year's 3-2, 12-inning victory over Western Michigan.
- Georgia State returns seven position starters from a year ago, but the only loss was a big one: three-time all-conference catcher and Johnny Bench Award semifinalist Joey Roach.
- The seven returning position starters combined for 322 starts last season and 472 in their careers, led by CF Ryan Blanton (121 career starts) and SS Justin Jones (106 career starts).
- Top returnees include CF Ryan Blanton (.255-6-20; 15 career HR), SS Justin Jones (.290-0-24), 3B Jarrett Hood (.338-2-36), 1B Jack Thompson (.299-6-35) and RF Darius Sewell (.308-3-22).
- Georgia State's 2017 schedule is perhaps the most ambitious in school history. The 2017 slate includes four different Power Five opponents and 13 games against 2016 NCAA Tournament teams, including a home series with Coastal Carolina, the defending national champions and the newest member of the Sun Belt Conference.
- Eleventh-year head coach Greg Frady is Georgia State's career leader in victories with 307 after passing Mike Hurst (293) on March 20, 2016. In the last year he has also been honored with two different Hall of Fame inductions, joining the German Baseball and Softball Hall of Fame and the Georgia Dugout Club Hall of Fame.
- In the last four years, eight different Panthers have earned a total of 11 All-American awards: Chase Raffield (All-American, 2013-14), Chad Prain (All-American, 2013), Nic Wilson (All-American, 2014), Matt Rose (Freshman All-American, 2013), Josh Merrigan (Freshman All-American, 2013), Scott Sarratt (Academic All-American, 2013), Justin Jones (Freshman All-American, 2015; Academic All-American, 2016), Joey Roach (Academic All-American, 2015-16).
- All but three players on the 2017 roster hail from Georgia, including 26 Panthers from the Atlanta area. Only Jaylen Woullard (Mississippi), Romero Greer (Texas) and Jansen Acton (Alabama) are not from the Peach State.

MORE ON THE ATLANTA CHALLENGE

- The field for the third annual Atlanta Challenge includes 2016 NCAA Regional team Western Michigan, along with two teams that won more than 30 games a year ago in BYU and Marshall.
- Georgia State is 2-4 in the two previous challenges.
- The Panthers opened last year's challenge with a 3-2, 12-inning victory over Western Michigan in the only previous meeting with any of this year's three opponents. The game was scoreless until the 11th inning, when each team scored two runs before the Panthers won it in the 12th on a walk-off single by Israel Zackery.
- Western Michigan pitching coach Blaine McFerrin served in the same capacity on Greg Frady's Georgia State staff from 2007-10.
- BYU's journey from Provo, Utah to Atlanta is nearly 1,900 miles, the most distant opponent that the Georgia State baseball program has faced, home or away. Previously, the most distant opponents were Air Force, which travelled to Panthersville in 2010, and New Mexico State, which Georgia State visited in 2010.

GEORGIA STATE ON OPENING DAY:

Georgia State has won four straight Opening Day games, including last year's 3-2, 12-inning victory over Western Michigan. The Panthers are 7-3 in season openers under Greg Frady, with two of the three losses coming at No. 25 Alabama (2007) and at No. 6 Florida State (2010). Since 1997, the Panthers are 14-6 in season openers.

NATIONAL HONORS: In the last four years, eight different Panthers have earned a total of 11 All-America awards: Chase Raffield (All-American, 2013-14), Chad Prain (All-American, 2013), Nic Wilson (All-American, 2014), Matt Rose (Freshman All-American, 2013), Josh Merrigan (Freshman All-American, 2013), Scott Sarratt (Academic All-American, 2013), Justin Jones (Freshman All-American, 2015; Academic All-American, 2016), Joey Roach (Academic All-American, 2015-16).

PRO BALL EXPERIENCE: Georgia State's pitching staff is coached by former Major League hurler Chris Bootcheck, in his first year on the GSU staff. Bootcheck was an All-American at Auburn and a first-round draft pick by the Los Angeles Angels in 2000. He played in seven Major League seasons from 2003-13, primarily with the Angels, and his pro career included stops in Japan and Korea.

Hitting coach and recruiting coordinator Adam Pavkovich was also drafted by the Angels,

who took him in the 11th round of the 2003 Draft out of Alabama. Pavkovich reached the Triple A level in his eight-year pro career.

Also an Alabama grad, assistant coach Brock Bennett was a 33rd-round selection by the San Francisco Giants in 2011.

ALL-AMERICAN, TIMES TWO: Junior short-stop Justin Jones has earned two different All-America honors in his first two seasons. In 2015, he was a Freshman All-American by Collegiate Baseball newspaper as he hit .297 with 28 RBI and 35 runs scored. Then last year, Jones was a third-team CoSIDA Academic All-American with a 4.04 cumulative GPA, the highest mark on the entire 33-man Academic All-America team.

THREE RETURN FROM INJURIES: Georgia State welcomes the return of three key players who missed the 2016 season with injuries: OF/DH Cam Sperry (knee)
RHP Logan Barnette (shoulder)
LHP Will White (elbow)

THE ELDER STATESMAN: Senior center fielder Ryan Blanton is by far Georgia State's most experienced player with 152 career games, including 121 starts. Blanton has a career batting average of .279 with 15 homers, 55 RBI and 102 runs scored, along with 11 outfield assists.

Also an outstanding student, Blanton has been on the Dean's List or President's List every semester and was named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District team in 2016. He plans to attend medical school.

MORE ON COACH FRADY

Georgia State's career leader in victories with 307, surpassing Mike Hurst (293, 1993-2006) with a 14-6 win over Arkansas State on March, 20, 2016. Earned victory No. 300 vs. Appalachian State.

Also has the highest winning percentage of any coach in GSU history.

After taking over a program with just two winning seasons in its history, he has guided the Panthers to six 30-win campaigns in the last nine years, highlighted by a conference title and NCAA regional berth in 2009.

His program has produced three All-Americans, four Freshman All-Americans, three preseason All-Americans, four Academic All-Americans and 42 all-conference or all-rookie honorees.

In the last four years alone, eight different Panthers have earned a total of 11 All-America awards.

Has coached prolific offensive teams throughout his Georgia State tenure, including clubs that:

- Led the nation in runs scored (2010);
- Ranked third in the nation in batting average and fourth in runs per game (2013);
- Ranked second in the nation in home runs per game (2014).

Served 11 years (2004-14) as manager of the German National Team and was inducted into the German Baseball and Softball Hall of Fame in 2016.

Seven of his collegiate players and three of his German team standouts have reached the Major Leagues, including former Georgia State pitcher David Buchanan.

Five GSU players and four signees have been selected in the Major League Baseball draft over the last three years.

Inducted into the Georgia Dugout Club Hall of Fame in 2017.

Won a Division II national title as a player at Troy State.
