LEADING OFF

- Georgia State plays its final midweek game at long-time rival Mercer on Tuesday at 6 p.m. The Panthers have won four of the last five in the series, including a 4-2 victory in Atlanta on April 18.
- Still fighting for a berth in the Sun Belt Conference tournament, the Panthers then conclude the regular season at Georgia Southern, beginning Thursday.
- The Panthers are coming off a series victory over Appalachian State. Ace Hunter Gaddis won the Friday game, 4-2, and then seniors Justin Jones and Jordan Lee and freshman Ryan Glass provided the heroics in a 3-2 win on Senior Day. Jones homered in the first inning and then smacked a game-tying double in the bottom of the ninth, setting up Glass' walk-off single. Lee allowed two runs on four hits in a career-high 7.1 innings with seven strikeouts, also a career best.
- Seniors Justin Jones (4.11 GPA) and Will Kilgore (3.91 GPA) were named last week to the Google Cloud Academic All-District® baseball team by CoSIDA. Both are now eligible for the Google Cloud Academic All-America® baseball team, which will be announced next month.
- Jones is already a two-time CoSIDA Academic All-America®, earning second-team honors in 2017 after third-team accolades in 2016.
- Junior catcher Nick Gatewood is fourth in the Sun Belt with 12 homers, fifth in RBI (46) and eighth in batting average (.330).
- Two Georgia State players have been named National Player of the Week by Collegiate Baseball this season in junior catcher Nick Gatewood (April 9) and freshman DH Ryan Glass (May 14). That gives GSU seven National Player of the Week Awards in the last five seasons.
- Glass was honored as National Player of the Week this week after homering in three straight games and then hitting a walk-off single on Senior Day.
- Glass, the 6-4, 220-pound freshman who homered in his first collegiate at-bat in the Opening Day win over Bradley, now has seven homers on the season, the most for a GSU freshman since 1997.
- Gatewood was named National Player of the Week by Collegiate Baseball and Perfect Game as well as Sun Belt Player of the Week after going 8-for-15 with four homers, 11 RBI and nine runs scored in four games while catching 34 of 35 innings.
- On April 6 vs. Arkansas State, right fielder Brandon Bell became just the second player in GSU history to hit for the cycle (Mark Micowski vs. N.C. Central, 2010). Bell was 5-for-5: single, double, single, 3-run HR, triple. His cycle came one game after he hit a grand slam at Furman.
- Friday starter Hunter Gaddis (8-3) leads the Sun Belt with eight victories and ranks fifth in ERA (3.18) and sixth in strikeouts (77). Following his standout rookie season (4-4, 3.72), Gaddis became the first Panther to pitch for the Team USA Collegiate National Team in the summer of 2017.
- Gaddis has twice been named Sun Belt Pitcher of the Week:
 - March 26: Threw his second complete game in 7-2 win vs. South Alabama, allowing four hits and striking out eight. He blanked the Jags for seven innings before allowing two runs in the eighth.
 - March 12: Complete-game, three-hit shutout with a career-high 10 strikeouts and no walks in 2-0 win at Samford. He took a no-hitter into the sixth inning.
- Gaddis also defeated No. 16 Coastal Carolina as he allowed two runs on five hits with eight strikeouts over seven innings.

■ The Georgia State pitching staff tied a 22-year-old school record by striking out 18 batters in a 6-5, 12-inning win over Louisiana (April 27). Four pitchers were involved: Hunter Gaddis (8), Brandon Baker (4), Jansen Acton (3) and Tyler Koch (3). The record was first set vs. Furman in 1996.

■ Justin Jones, hitting .310, reached another milestone last weekend at ULM with his 100th career RBI. He is one of 12 players in school history with 200 career hits, 100 RBI and 100 runs scored.

■ In the April 27 6-5 win over Louisiana, Jones tied the game with a homer in the eighth inning and then won it in the 12th with a squeeze bunt. That is the fifth time in his career he has driven in the winning run in extra innings.

■ Now in his 12th season, head coach Greg Frady is Georgia State's career victory leader with 354 for the Panthers as part of his 541 career wins.

JONES' RECORD WATCH: With 210 career games, senior shortstop Justin Jones is collecting records and milestones.

■ GSU career leader in sacrifice bunts with 36 (Previous record: 33 by Ryan Sterling, 2003-05).

■ Hit by pitch 33 times, second in GSU history to Bradley Logan, 35, 2007-10.

■ GSU's career leader in fielding assists with 598 (Previous record was 524 by Michael Brand, 1993-96).

■ Has 231 career hits to stand seventh in GSU history. Next up is No. 6 Josh Vandiver with 233.

■ Tied for fifth with 137 career runs scored.

■ Tied for sixth with 89 career walks.

■ Tied for sixth with 45 career doubles.

■ Tied for fourth with 787 career at-bats and seventh with 210 games played.

SERIES VS. MERCER: Georgia State has won four of the last five in the series, including the last game in Macon, and six of the last eight.

■ Since head coach Greg Frady took over in 2007, GSU leads Mercer 12-8.

■ Georgia State won the first meeting this season, 4-2 in Atlanta on April 18. Jack Thompson hit a two-run homer and Will Kilgore

added a solo shot. Five Panther pitchers held the Bears to six hits with 10 strikeouts.

■ In the last meeting at Mercer in 2016, the Panthers rallied for five runs in the ninth inning to win 10-6. Jack Thompson hit a three-run homer in the game, and Will Kilgore had a two-run single.

■ Mercer leads the overall series, which began in 1967, 67-50, but since Georgia State reinstated its program in 1992, the Panthers lead 39-36, including a 35-26 advantage since 1996.

■ Mercer is Georgia State's most frequent opponent as the two schools have played more than 100 times since 1967. Every year that GSU has fielded a baseball team, it has played Mercer at least once.

EXTRA EFFORT: Five times in his career, shortstop Justin Jones has driven in the game-winning run in extra innings.

- Walk-off bunt single in 12th vs. Louisiana, 2018
- Walk-off double in 11th vs. ULM, 2017
- Double in top of 11th at Ole Miss, 2017

In addition, he has four game-tying or go-ahead hits in the eighth inning or later, three of them homers:

■ App State, 2018: Tied the game with one-out double in the bottom of the ninth; GSU won 3-2 on walk-off by Ryan Glass.

■ Louisiana, 2018: Led off 8th with solo homer to tie game at 5-5; GSU won 6-5 on Jones' squeeze bunt.

■ Coastal Carolina, 2018: Led off 8th with solo homer to break 2-2 tie; GSU won 3-2.

■ UT Arlington, 2017: Solo homer in 8th to break 1-1 tie; GSU won 2-1.

HAVE A DAY, ROOKIE: Freshman designated hitter Ryan Glass made quite a splash in his Georgia State debut as the 6-4, 220-pound rookie homered in his first collegiate at-bat and drove in all three runs in the Panthers' 3-1 Opening Day victory over Bradley.

Glass came to the plate in the first inning with two outs and Nick Gatewood at first base. On the 1-0 count, he crushed a fastball well over the left field fence to give GSU the early lead.

Georgia State held the same 2-0 lead in the sixth inning when Glass came to the plate

MORE ON COACH FRADY

Georgia State's career leader in victories with 354, surpassing Mike Hurst (293, 1993-2006) on March, 20, 2016. Also has the highest winning percentage of any coach in GSU history.

Reached 500 career victories, including 187 at North Florida C.C., vs. Northern Kentucky on March 4, 2017. Now has 541 career wins.

After taking over a program with just two winning seasons in its history, he has guided the Panthers to six 30-win campaigns in the last 10 years, highlighted by a conference title and NCAA regional berth in 2009.

His program has produced three All-Americans, four Freshman All-Americans, three preseason All-Americans, three Academic All-Americans and 42 all-conference or all-rookie honorees.

In the last five years, eight different Panthers have earned a total of 12 All-America awards.

Has coached prolific offensive teams throughout his Georgia State tenure, including clubs that:

- Led the nation in runs scored (2010);
- Ranked third in the nation in batting average and fourth in runs per game (2013);
- Ranked second in the nation in home runs per game (2014).

Served 11 years (2004-14) as manager of the German National Team and was inducted into the German Baseball and Softball Hall of Fame in 2016.

Seven of his collegiate players and three of his German team standouts have reached the Major Leagues, including former Georgia State pitcher David Buchanan.

Six GSU players and five signees have been selected in the Major League Baseball draft over the last four years.

Inducted into the Georgia Dugout Club Hall of Fame in 2017.

Won a Division II national title as a player at Troy State.

FUTURE HOME OF THE PANTHERS

In 2017, Georgia State University purchased the former Turner Field property occupied by the Atlanta Braves.

The venue is now Georgia State Stadium and is the home of Panther football.

In the near future, the GSU baseball program will move into a new stadium that will be constructed adjacent to Georgia State Stadium. The baseball facility will be on the footprint of the former Atlanta Fulton-County Stadium, where Hank Aaron hit home run No. 715 and the Braves won the 1995 World Series.

The area will also include student housing as well as retail development, becoming an extension of Georgia State's rapidly growing downtown Atlanta campus.
